# Description of the route



#### 1. LA DEVESA PARK

The name of the park comes from a common term which has become a proper name. The word "devesa" designates an area of land covered by natural vegetation, used for grazing and providing timber. This was precisely the initial function of this place, which later became a popular place for walking. La Devesa joined the list of Assets of Cultural Interest in 1943.



#### 2. BOTANICAL GARDENS

The Gardens of La Devesa date from the 19th century, when gardens became fashionable places for the wealthier classes to take their walks. They were inspired by French models and still retain a structure that recalls the original, ringed by a canal and with parterres separated by bushes clipped into geometric shapes. A number of different elements can be found in the gardens, such as the del brollador fountain, the peacock enclosure, the characteristic gardener's shed, the greenhouse and several sculptures. There is a wide range of plant species, some of them native to the region, but most of them exotic, originally from other countries.



#### 3. THE LONDON PLANE

The London Plane (Platanus hybrida) is the most commonly found tree in La Devesa, where over 2,600 specimens are to be found. It is a deciduous tree which normally grows as high as 40 metres. In La Devesa, however, they can reach considerably higher, up to 60 metres or more, because they were planted guite close together and have had to grow upwards in order to seek out the sunlight.

Their large, wide leaves with five pointed lobes have become one of the symbols of the city.

# La Devesa and the Ribes del Ter Park

## La Devesa and the Ribes del Ter Park

This route will take you through two of the most important green areas in Girona: the parks of La Devesa and Les Ribes del Ter, both located in the north-west of the city, on either side of the River Ter.

La Devesa is one of the most iconic and characteristic places in the city. It is a large park covering over 40 hectares of land, three quarters of which are covered by plane trees arranged in wide avenues, forming a total of six blocks.

On the other side of the river, the Ribes del Ter Park is a broad open space bordered by riverbank vegetation and located just in front of the Girona Fontajau Sports Hall. The park forms part of the natural area of Les Ribes del Ter, a wetland which includes the banks of the river as it flows through Girona. The fact that this well-preserved area forms part of the city centre makes it very important from an ecological and environmental point of view.





The route, which is about 3,5 km long, is relatively easy and is suitable for people with restricted mobility. The Natura Local application provides information on the routes included in this leaflet, with audio narration, subtitles and sign language.

#### 4. THE USES OF THE PARK

La Devesa has multiple uses, combining nature activities, social and sporting events and economic initiatives which require suitable management to guarantee the conservation of the park's natural and ecological values. As well as the six blocks of plane trees, there is a swimming pool, different sports facilities, children's play areas, large open gravel areas and other buildings used for various purposes. La Devesa is also the home of a market every Tuesday and Saturday and the setting for the attractions of the Fair of Sant Narcís, held every October.



#### 5. RIVER TER

The Ter passes through five of the counties of Girona for a total of 208 kilometres until it reaches the Mediterranean. It is a typical river of the Mediterranean region, flowing strongly in the spring and autumn. The River Ter has a large number of tributaries, including the other three rivers in the city, which join the Ter in places very close to this sector.




#### 6. THE RIBES DEL TER PARK


The Ribes del Ter Park was created in the mid-1990s as part of the urban planning affecting the Fontajau sector and the construction of the sports hall as a way of organizing the area on the left bank of the Ter. Besides the construction of the walkway, a small weir was built across the river to raise the level of the water just below the walkway. The objective was to create a much larger surface area of open water than was originally the case and, since its construction, reeds, bulrushes and other riverbank vegetation have grown around it.



#### 7. 'LA FAMILIA'

The metal sculpture group called *La família* by Xavier Corberó represents a picnic scene. The basket close to the family and the setting in the open air help to identify the actions of the rather abstract human figures as that of a family taking part in a picnic.

#### 8. NATURA 2000 NETWORK

The Ribes del Ter Park forms part of the natural area known as Les Riberes del Baix Ter, which includes all the lower part of the river in the Girona region and enjoys the protection of the European ecological initiative called the Natura 2000 Network. The objective of the Natura 2000 Network is to create a legal framework to guarantee the protection of natural areas in Europe and to protect a representative sample of the main European habitats and species.



#### 9. BIRD OBSERVATORY

The presence of water and food and the sheltered habitat provided by the vegetation have made the banks of the river into areas of biodiversity, especially as far as birds are concerned. The Park of Les Ribes del Ter offers a magnificent opportunity to observe the wildlife from the north bank. It is an ideal place for observing and listening to many species of native and migratory birds, the latter's presence in the region determined by the seasons.



#### 10. RIVERSIDE WOODLAND

Many areas of woodland are to be found along the course of the river, populated by poplars, willows, alders and small-leaved ash trees. The riverbank woodland is one of the most productive and biologically diverse habitats in Catalonia, adapted to the instability of the river, which brings an abundant supply of water but also the ever-present risk of flooding.
